- 4. Matters Arising
- 4.1 Brompton-on-Swale Golf Society Sponsorship of Trophies (Minutes 6 Dec, item 4.1)
 Mrs Carol Birch and Mrs Helen Frankland declared a conflict of interest in this item.
 A constitution of the Brompton-on-Swale Golf Society was given to the Parish Council. The resident reminded Councillors this replaced a previous society. 5. Reports

5.1 Report from Cllr Threlfall – RDC

Cllr Threlfall mentioned concerns regarding the noise from the A1. RDC have met with Highways England. A customer survey has been prompted. Completion of planting will take place in February 2019. There was a commitment at that meeting to extend the noise reduction fencing from where it is south of Bridge Road to north of Station Road. An evaluation will take place in March 2019 with re-evaluation in July 2019. RDC will be copied in to all details from the evaluations.

Three parishes have confirmed interest in the concept of purchasing a shared speed matrix sign. Cllr Threlfall will put a package together to present at a later date.

Cllr Haynes asked whether it was correctly reported that RDC would be voting for extending the window for people with bus passes to be able to get to medical appointments. He said if this were correct it appeared Brompton-on-Swale was the only route not mentioned. Cllr Threlfall will look into the details.

5.2 Report from Cllr Les – NYCC

Bridge Road resurfacing from the motorway overbridge to the Farmers Arms junction is scheduled for resurfacing. There are no further updates on the riverside footpath.

The NYCC Vehicle Activated Sign Protocol has been drafted. The scheme will go live on 1 April. NYCC are negotiating with manufacturers regarding price.

Council tax will be increased by 2.99% plus adult social care. There is £40 M to find over the next 3 years with £13 m this year.

The Chairman mentioned the area on Gatherley Road where there had been a vehicle fire. A resident had said that a mess remained and asked if this could be cleared. The Clerk will report to Area 1
